Appointments

Each new family is asked to contact the College Uniform Shop on (08) 6330 0250 to make an appointment to purchase their daughter's uniform. All new parents must make an appointment.

Appointments allow for individual service so that the fitting of the uniform is a pleasant experience. Each appointment may take approximately 30 - 45 minutes.

All uniform items (including black shoes) are available at the College Uniform Shop. Students may come and purchase without a parent. Care is taken to fit the student correctly.

Returns

Garments may be returned/exchanged if they are complete with swing tags and receipt, and if they have not been worn, altered or laundered.

Payment

Personal Presentation

Students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance, to be neatly attired and to be well groomed.

Uniform

An explanatory note from a parent/guardian is required if a student cannot wear a part of the College uniform. PE Uniform is not the default uniform for shoe/foot/leg issues. Three uniform infringements will result in after-school detention.

The uniform is a sign of identity with the College and should be worn with pride. Each student is expected to be properly attired in full uniform, whilst at the College, travelling to and from the College, and when representing the College at external events.

Personal Presentation

- Students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance, to be neatly attired and well groomed.
- College blazer is always worn as the outer garment outside the College and for assemblies, not the school jumper.
- During Terms 1 and 4, the College hat must be worn to and from school.
- College jumper may be worn during the school day throughout the year.
- Winter uniform shirts are to be worn tucked in.
- Uniform dresses and skirts are to be knee length.
- Hair that is collar length or longer must be neatly tied back.
- Hair accessories are to be kept simple and to be in College colours of red, white or bottle green.
- Hair that is obviously streaked, tinted or dyed, or is a colour not natural to the student is not permitted (this includes eyebrows).
- Coloured nail polish and false nails (including French polish) are not permitted.
- Make up is not permitted.
- False/extension eyelashes are not permitted.
- Socks are to be folded white ankle socks, NOT sports socks.
- Shoes and laces must be in good condition and shoes must be polished regularly.
- Sports shoes are to be predominantly white. If difficult to purchase white shoes then shoes in subtle colours should be chosen rather than fluorescent or black.

Jewellery

- Accessories are restricted to a wristwatch, one simple ring and one simple gold/silver neck chain with a Christian symbol.
- Students may wear one small silver or gold sleeper or stud in the bottom hole of each ear lobe. Sleepers should be no more than 12mm in diameter and studs should be no more than 5mm in diameter.
- No other piercings of any kind are permitted. Students who attend the College with additional piercings will have them confiscated.
- Rings, necklaces, studs or sleepers are not to be embellished with gems, coloured stones or beads of any kind.
- Bangles, bracelets and anklets of any kind are not permitted.

Stockings

In Terms 2 and 3 students are expected to wear opaque black tights. Student Reception and the College Uniform Shop keep a supply of stockings which can be purchased throughout the day. If a student's stockings are laddered or have holes in them, students will be required to purchase a new pair. Keeping a spare pair of stockings in the student's bag is recommended.

Students in Years 5 & 6 may wear white ankle socks during Terms 2 & 3.

Casual Dress Days

On casual dress days, students are required to dress in accordance with the above guidelines in order to participate in the day's program and activities. The College's expectations of such occasions are published in the daily notices prior to the event.

Summer Uniform: Terms 1 and 4

- College summer dress

Winter Uniform: Terms 2 and 3

- College blazer
- Green College jumper
- Red College jumper (Year 12 only)
- Tartan winter skirt - required for all formal events (excursions/graduation)
- College pants (optional) to be worn with black socks
- White College shirt
- Tartan tie
- Black lace-up shoes (with heel height less than 2.5cm)
- Black tights (Years 7 - 12)
- White College socks (Years 5 and 6)
- College backpack

Sport uniform

- College tracksuit jacket **Red tracksuit jacket is preferred (the old style tracksuit top is being phased out).*
- College tracksuit pants
- White sports jumper (optional)
- House polo shirt
- White College polo shirt
- Red College shorts
- College hat
- College sport cap (Years 5 - 12) (compulsory for all outdoor activities)
- College sport socks
- Black College bathers
- IGSSA Bathers (for members of interschool swimming only) (Advised to try on due to different sizing)
- College rashie
- House swimming cap
- Sport shoes (predominantly white)
- College sport bag
- Years 5 & 6: House t-shirt - Sport
White t-shirt - Physical Education

Other

- College scarf (red)
- College athletics/cross country outfit
- Red, white or green hair accessories
- College library bag (Years 5 and 6)
- College school bag (all years)

Please note:

- All clothes are to be clearly labelled with the student's name, not initials, and House on them.
- All bags are to have students' names on them and a tag to make them easily identifiable.
- Name labels and tags can be purchased at the uniform shop.
- Students who do not follow the College uniform policy risk being given an after-school detention.
