

ACCESS PATHWAY

The ACCESS Pathway provides opportunities for students through Vocational Education & Training (VET) qualifications and Workplace Learning.

TAFE QUALIFICATIONS AND VET CERTIFICATES

ACCESS students at Santa Maria College have the opportunity to complete a VET Certificate II or higher as part of their College Program.

Below is an outline of VET that is available:

- In Year 11, ACCESS students complete a Certificate II or III or a two year Certificate IV. Year 11 students who choose this option will complete 5 courses and be off campus one day per week.
- In Year 12, ACCESS students may choose a minimum of four courses and a VET Certificate off campus where they attend TAFE one or two days a week.

ALLIED HEALTH & NURSING

Allied Health and Nursing are the most competitive fields of university study to access for a school graduate. Consequently, Santa Maria College has dedicated a great deal of time and resources to ensure that students who want to work in the allied health or nursing fields have every possible opportunity.



Year 11 Pathways into Allied Health & Nursing

Year 11 ACCESS students can enrol in Certificate III in Health Services Assistance and in Year 12 progress to a Certificate IV in Preparation for Health & Nursing Studies through the Registered Training Organisation, Health Science Hub (HSH). There are fees associated with both qualifications payable directly to HSH, with Santa Maria College providing a one-off subsidy on College fees. These qualifications may lead to careers in nursing, physiotherapy, or many allied health areas. Students would attend the campus of HSH one day a week and complete workplace learning in the usual blocks of May and October.

Year 12 Pathways into Allied Health & Nursing

Students in Year 12 may complete a Certificate IV in Preparation for Health & Nursing Studies over one year through Health Science Hub, attending one day a week on the Murdoch University campus.

WORKPLACE LEARNING

Workplace Learning is a School Curriculum and Standards Authority Developed Endorsed Program managed by the College. Students will have the opportunity to complete three different workplaces during the Years 11 and 12 ATAR exam periods in May and October.

This is a compulsory part of the ACCESS Program.

The Workplace Learning Endorsed Program provides an opportunity for students to demonstrate and develop increasing competence in the core skills for work, often referred to as employability skills.



Developing competence in workplace skills assists an individual to gain employment and, in the longer term, to progress within the organisation in which they are employed, to contribute successfully to the organisation's objectives.

To complete this Endorsed Program, a student works in one or more workplace/s to develop a set of transferable workplace skills, and the student records tasks undertaken in the workplace in a Workplace Learning Logbook.

The student must also provide evidence of their knowledge and understanding of the workplace skills by completing the College's Workplace Learning Skills Journal after every fifty-five hours completed in the workplace.
